JOB SUMMARY

Under direct supervision, performs general labor and maintenance of the Airfield, AOA ramps and associated equipment. Performs manual labor in a variety of construction and maintenance functions as related to the maintenance of the Airfield. **Work schedules will include weekends and nights and occasional overtime. On occasion may be subject to being called in during non-scheduled hours to respond to any situation related to the responsibilities of the position, or any situation determined necessary by the department.**

JOB RESPONSIBILITIES

Essential Job Responsibilities:

Performs general maintenance work including, but not limited to:

Airfield mowing. To include Runway Safety Areas (RSA) and all airfield turf areas. Mowing equipment will be inspected daily for safety and needed repairs as well as routine maintenance.

Paved area maintenance. To include all runways, taxiways, ramps, and aprons associated with the Airport authority. All areas will be maintained in accordance with FAA Part 139 guidelines. Surfaces will include various concrete and asphalt compounds.

Painting. To include runway and taxiway markings, surface painted signs, ramp, and movement areas. Daily maintenance of the painting equipment.

Airfield lighting. To include Assisting Airfield Electricians with diagnosing, repairing, and replacing all components of airfield lighting, guidance and illuminated signage systems.

Airfield turf and grounds maintenance and repairs. To include filling and leveling around light bases, drainage structures, runway, and taxiway edges. Elimination of wildlife damage and habitat. Fills washouts and plants sod. Performs application of pesticides, herbicides, and fertilization, as required. Trimming and/or elimination of trees and shrubbery.

Concrete. To include the pouring and finishing of concrete into forms created by the Airfield Group.

Cleaning of surfaces. To include runways, taxiways, ramps, signage, and markings. Daily routine maintenance of the cleaning equipment.

Inspections. To include daily inspections and checks on various aspects of the airfield and associated areas and systems. Findings should be reported to supervisor.

Preparation and maintenance of airfield for FAA Part 139 inspections.

Other Related Responsibilities:

Although usually assigned to one area, cross-trains with and assists other Facilities personnel on an as needed basis.

MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT USED

Painting equipment including striping machines. Cleaning equipment including power washers, steam washers and sweeper trucks. Power and hand tools. Mowing equipment of various sizes to include zero turn and tractors with mowing decks. Trucks and trailers.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

Where "preferred" is indicated, the qualification is not essential.

Education and Experience:

High School Diploma or GED.

Two years' experience working in a maintenance department, **Preferred**.

Licenses and Certifications:

Valid Florida License or must obtain within (30) days of assuming position and a good driving record.

Valid Florida Commercial Driver's License (CDL). **Preferred**.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

Knowledge of principles, practices, and methods of basic maintenance.

Knowledge of potential safety hazards and related safety precautions.

Knowledge of ground maintenance and equipment maintenance. **Preferred**.

Skill in the use of hand and power tools.

Ability to perform routine and physical work.

FAA Part 139 knowledge/experience. **Preferred**.

Ability to understand and interpret oral and written instructions.

Ability to develop and maintain effective working relationships with superiors and fellow employees.

Physical Requirements:

The Maintenance Technician, Airfield, must be physically fit to perform manual labor. Physical work is performed both outside and indoors in all weather conditions for extended periods of time.

Mental Requirements:

A Maintenance Technician, Airfield, performs general maintenance of Airport grounds, airfield, and equipment. The Maintenance Technician works wherever he/she is needed and in all kinds of weather conditions. Accordingly individual must be able to work with and understand instructions from various people and change work direction quickly.

Environmental Requirements:

The majority of a Maintenance Technician's workday is spent working in a hands-on capacity on a variety of projects requiring labor outside and indoors in all types of weather conditions for extended periods of time. Physical work is continuous.

Summary Clause:

The duties and responsibilities listed in this job class specification are intended only as illustrations of the various duties to be performed and are not all inclusive. The omission of other specific duties does not exclude them from being performed by the Maintenance Technician, Airfield if the duties are similar, related, or a logical assignment to the position. This job class specification does not constitute an employment contract between SMAA and the Maintenance Technician, Airfield and is subject to change at the discretion of the Airport Authority.

This Class Specification should not be interpreted as all inclusive. It is intended to identify the major responsibilities and requirements of this job. The incumbents may be requested to perform job-related responsibilities and tasks other than those stated in this description, but which are commensurate with similar levels of responsibility.
